Designing Spaces to renovate local veteran's home

One fortuitous Marine, recipient of a Purole Heart, will receive a home renovation from Designing Spaces®, a home improvement show airing on Lifetime TV.

1st Lt. Robert M. Keefe Jr. enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps in February 2001 and completed his recruit training at Parris Island. Following recruit training, he completed various Military Occupational Specialty (MOS) training courses to become a reconnaissance marine, subsequently being assigned to 3rd Reconnaissance Battalion, 3rd Marine Division, III Marine Expeditionary Force in Okinawa, Japan.

Following Basic School and Logistics Officer Course, Lt. Keefe was assigned to Combat Logistics Battalion 2, Combat Logistics Regiment 2, in November 2009. Lt. Keefe

platoon during the battalion's deployment to Afghanistan from July 2010 to February 2011. During the deployment, his Humvee hit an Improvised Explosive Device (IED), causing severe spinal injuries which rendered him unable to continue military service. In addition to the T12/L1 vertebrae compression fracture and traumatic brain injury, Lt. Keefe also sustained PTSD (Post Traumatic Stress Disorder) and memory loss. He medically separated from the service on Nov. 29, 2012 and continues to serve — through any capacity possible — as a veteran advocate, volunteer, mentor and public speaker.

Lt. Keefe's personal decorations include the Purple Heart, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal and Good Conduct Medal with Bronze Star.

Gunny Ermey is a retired United States Marine Corps Staff Sergeant and drill instructor.
